







John Maddox Roberts began his Roman historical mysteries in 1990 with the first in the SPQR series: The King's Gambit (Tp 29.95) and followed in 1991 with the second The Catiline Conspiracy (Tp 29.95) and the third The Sacrilege (Tp 29.95). In 1992, he published the fourth in the series, The Temple of the Muses (Tp 29.95), and then stopped writing them. He then released three modern novels in the Gabe Treloar series, plus a number of science fiction and fantasy titles. In 1999, he returned to the world of ancient Rome and released the fifth in the series Saturnalia (Tp 29.95) and continued the series each year with Nobody Loves a Centurion (Tp 29.95) (#6), The Tribune's Curse (Tp 29.95) (#7) and now in paperback the eighth in the series: The River God's Vengeance (Tp 29.95). The ninth, The Princess and the Pirates is due in hardback later this month @ 49.95. We still have a few copies

of The River God's Vengeance left in Hb @ 49.95. The series is set in the later days of the Roman Republic from the times of Crassus



and Pompey to Julius Caesar and features the wellborn Decius Caecilius Metellus the Younger as the sleuth. The series is highly entertaining and the characters are convincing, while the historical details are spot on.



The River God's Vengeance (290pp Tp 29.95)

In the waning days of the Roman republic, the adventures of Decius Metellus have taken him from one end of the empire to the other, usually fleeing from trouble just to find himself in more trouble wherever he ends up going. With a family as impressive as his name sounds, a close friendship with the leader of one of Rome's most powerful street gangs, and a marriage to the niece of Julius Caesar, he has finally taken the first step on Rome's political ladder, with an election to the lowly office of aedile. When Decius's official responsibilities require him to investigate the collapse of a tenement building, his sense of duty won't allow him to write it off as just another example of greedy slumlords using shoddy materials. As Decius's hunt for justice implicates some of Rome's most powerful figures, so powerful that even Cicero can't help Decius, he must turn for help to a most unlikely ally. In this eighth instalment of the series, Roberts once again provides authentic detail in the everyday Roman customs, as well as a fascinating picture of the increasingly unsteady position of this famed republic. If you enjoy Roman historical mysteries, then John Maddox Roberts' SPQR series is not one to overlook.


Many years ago, Ellen Mosley became Eve Michaels. She left her husband, her adored



They find the cadaver of a woman who died under circumstances they cannot figure out. Was it murder? Suicide? Or something else? 

Attempting to trace the letter, the last thing Hamish needs is distraction, but soon Jenny Ogilvie arrives, determined to seduce him. Now, Hamish finds himself in a race to solve the mystery of the poison pen letters before someone else dies, including one likely target, Jenny. (American)

When Caleb Mean is born, his grandmother has a vision telling her he is the Chosen One. On Caleb's 33rd birthday, he locks the whole community into the meeting hall and incinerates them. The only survivors are Caleb, his lover Virginia and their baby daughter, Golden. How could such a thing happen? Do the answers lie in the history of Skye itself, founded by the unlikely survivors of a 19th century shipwreck? Or do the only real clues lie in the dark truths of fairytales? This is a chilling and bewitching novel about the terrible power of faith, and confirms Carmel Bird as one of our finest and most original writers. (Australian)
