

Skeleton Man: A Joe Leaphorn and Jim Chee novel

Leaphorn comes out of retirement to help investigate what seems to be a trading post robbery. The simple kid nailed for the crime is related to a former colleague. Proving the kid's innocence requires finding the remains of one of 172 people whose bodies were scattered over the Grand Canyon in an epic airline disaster 50 years ago. One of those passengers, a diamond dealer, had an attaché case containing a fortune in diamonds handcuffed to his wrist. Now his daughter is also seeking his body, and so is a most unpleasant fellow who is willing to kill to make sure she doesn't succeed. These two tense tales collide deep in the canyon at the place where an old man died trying to build a cult-reviving reverence for the Hopi guardian of the Underworld. It is a race to the finish in a thunderous monsoon storm to see who will be brought to justice and who will finally unearth the **Skeleton Man** (Pb 19.95).

Other titles in this excellent series starring two Navajo policemen include: **Blessing Way**, **Coyote Waits** (16.95), **Dance Hall of the Dead** (19.95), **Dark Wind**, **The Fallen Man**, **Finding Moon**, **The Fly on the Wall**, **The Ghostway**, **Hunting Badger**, **Listening Woman**, **People of Darkness**, **Scared Clowns**, **The Sinister Pig**, **Skinwalkers**, **Talking God**, **A Thief of Time** and **The Wailing Wind** (all 18.95 unless otherwise indicated).

Another interesting title, which also includes a Jim Chee mini-mystery, is **Talking Mysteries: A Conversation with Tony Hillerman** (Tp 29.95). Hillerman discusses his craft, including his approach to plot, characterisation and setting, and the wrinkles and twists that make his brand of fiction unique. His wonderful series, which I can highly recommend, has earned him the Navajo people's appreciation as 'special friend to the Dineh'.

Then it comes to light that he believed he was on the track of an infamous Stradivari violin twin to one housed in the Asmolean Museum and subject to 200 years of myth and rumour. With nothing else to go on, his two close friends pick up the search from where he left off, plunging headlong into a world where great musical instruments change hands for millions, where forgery is an art form and where murder is often a dealer's chosen method of negotiation! Death of a Bore



And she isn't alone - other girls have recently met a similar fate. When the daughter of a prominent family also disappears, she finds herself in a desperate bid to put the pieces of the puzzle together before she is called, once again, to the water's edge. The Sins of the Fathers 256pp Hb 49.95



The Unpublished Fiction of George V Higgins 308pp Tp 35.00



Drug Lords: The Rise and Fall of the Cali Cartel 326pp Pb 24.95

For 20 years, the Cali drug cartel, a vast criminal conspiracy, pumped thousands of tons of cocaine into the US, laundered billions of dollars in profits and was responsible for endemic political corruption and an



untold number of murders assassinations. It ultimately controlled 70% of the world's cocaine market. flooding towns and cities with the addictive white powder dubbed 'the champagne of drugs'. Through organised violence, terrorist strategies, intimidation and bribery, the cartel became a major threat to Colombia's fragile stability. It also brought an unprecedented degree of strategy and planning to the drugs trade. It would take more than two decades and a global effort to bring it down. (American)

Clarkson charts the extraordinary rise and spectacular fall of Charlie Wilson, the most powerful villain to emerge from Britain's crime of the 20th century: the Great Train Robbery. Wilson's life story is one of greed, corruption and an eventual descent into a living hell as his rivals decide to wipe him off the face of the earth, with the tacit approval of Spanish, British and US drug enforcement agencies. Frank Sinatra, Sir Peter Abeles, Jimmy the Weasel Fratianno... big celebrities, big business, big mobsters and big politicians, from the famous to the infamous, the cast of characters almost defies the imagination. Looking back on his tumultuous life, Bela Csidei, 'the accidental gangster', recalls a story that takes him from a childhood spent fishing with explosives and a little freelance arms dealing to holding a promissory note for \$250 million dollars. From his survival of war-torn Europe to two contracts on his life, Bela emerges as a genuinely colourful character and an optimistic, loveable rogue. Not only was Carolyn gunned down, but Kenneth was also killed. The hitman's getaway driver was the other woman, Adriana Vasco. The sensational trial unfolded a tangled web of lies, sex and betraval as Adriana and Dennis turned against each other... (American)




