Blood from a Stone 320pp Tp \$32.95

The stunning new Commissario Brunetti mystery from an author whose sales continue to grow with each new book.

On a cold Venetian night shortly before Christmas, a man is killed in a scuffle in Campo San Stefano. The closest witnesses to the event are the tourists who had been browsing the man's wares before his death - fake handbags of

every designer label. Officially termed а

venditore ambulante or extracomunitario, the dead man was working as a vu cumpra, one of the many Black Africans purveying goods outside normal shop hours and without work permits. Arriving on the scene, Commissario Brunetti's response matches that of everybody involved: why would anyone kill a vu cumpra? With few social connections and little money, in-fighting amongst these workers is the obvious answer. But once Brunetti begins investigating this Venetian underworld, he discovers that matters of great value are at stake within the immigrant society. Warned by Patta, his superior, to resist further involvement in the case, Brunetti only becomes more determined to unearth the truth behind this mysterious killing. However, reluctant as he is to let this event be smugly relegated to the category of 'not worth dealing with', how far will Brunetti be able to penetrate the murky subculture of Venice's illegal community? This is the 14th in this excellent series with wonderfully familiar characters, a powerful sense of place and expert plotting.

In an attempt to prove herself to Sam, who questions her PI abilities, Cassidy gets herself tied up (literally) in a high-speed shoot-out on a bus, a kidnapping, a drug bust and a couple of bizarre film shoots. Complicating her attempts to learn exactly how her brother died is Beck Merchant, her father's brilliant and canny attorney, who seems every bit as corrupt as her father. Yet despite her low opinion of Beck, Sayre finds herself irresistibly drawn to him. Tension between the workforce and management is mounting in Sayre's father's steel mill. While another hotbed of lies, secrecy and depravity smoulders and then ignites within his family... (American)

RECOMMENDED READING

A Ian CALDWELL & Dustin THOMASON The Rule of Four 527pp Pb 21.95

This was my favourite read of 2004. If you liked The Da Vinci Code (Pb 19.95), The Name of the Rose (Pb 24.95) or A Secret History (Pb 24.95), you will probably like this. It has all the characteristics of a murder mystery but is encoded with a very dark Renaissance secret, the twists and turns of which bedazzle brain cells to levels of pure enjoyment. The authors have been best friends since they were eight, each achieving awards for history at Princeton and Harvard respectively. This book was a post-graduation project, and at its centre is one of the rarest, most complex books in the world: Coded in seven languages, the Hypnerotomachia Poliphili (Hb 60.00), an intricate mathematical mystery and a tale of love and arcane



brutality, has baffled scholars since 1499. The Rule of Four brings it to life, gives it a modern context and makes tremendous reading. - Shelley (American)

Vertical Coffin 335pp Pb 16.95 A nightmarish series of events sweeps LAPD's Sgt Shane Scully and his wife (and boss) Alexa into the vortex of an enormous, jurisdictional firestorm. First, a sheriff's deputy is gunned down while serving a routine search warrant. Soon thereafter, a member of the ATF Situation Response Team is shot to death, followed by the sniper murder of the Sheriff's Special Enforcement Bureau. At the request of the Mayor, LAPD assigns Shane Scully to investigate. He is given an impossible deadline to find a solution before two elite and deadly SWAT Teams kill each other off. Shane pursues his investigation in a direction that neither his chief nor his wife agrees with, and succeeds in putting himself, his loved ones, and his career in terrible jeopardy before he finally discovers the shocking and deadly truth. The suspected cause of the raging epidemic is vast, unprecedented pollution that threatens to extinguish all life in the world's seas. This novel entwines his contemporary reporting with a chain of ancient stories-within-thestory, tracking the last time each of the geographer's tools changed hands - some bought, some stolen, some killed for. It is an extraordinary debut; smart, stylishly written and full of suspense. It tempts with the glitter of antiquities and hooks with a chilling plot. (American)

But Caroline's conscientious cohorts are dragging her deeper into the murky waters of environmental sabotage. And her hot-headed enthusiasm cannot be cooled, even after two people are brutally murdered. Caroline's on to something extremely toxic and unless Waterman can clear the air, her deadly dedication could poison him as well. (American)

Since the death of alchemical magus Dr John Dee, charlatans and forgers have a free hand to trick a gullible public into buying formulas for making gold. In the wider political scene it seems that England's honour has been pawned. A peace treaty has been signed with the Catholic enemy Spain, but the stability it brings is riven by rumblings of internal discontent against the Scottish king and his advisers. There is an underlying atmosphere of fear at the court, heightened by the paranoia of King James. His alienated son and heir, the 15year-old Prince Henry, looks on, dour, disapproving and ambitious and secretly thinking that if he were king, he would be leading an army at the French king's side, against the old enemy Spain. They are summoned to a crime scene that, not so familiarly, seems to vanish before their eyes, as they find themselves with neither evidence nor a client. They do not want for opposition, however; not with the governments of three great empires arrayed against them. As Holmes strives to unmask his most cunning, ruthless and elusive foe, he is transported into a world of high finance rife with intrigue and crime. With a cast of characters that includes the enchanting lady of fortune Countess D'Espinau and historical greats like Winston Churchill and Cecil Rhodes as well as a poorest-of-the-poor beggar girl whom Watson adopts, Holmes follows a trail that leads ultimately and unpredictably to the fabled and fabulous lost Hapsburg tiara. brilliant executive Kathleen Atwater, the first female student accepted at Duke University's School of Engineering. The Petersons seemed the ideal academic couple: well-respected, prosperous and happy. All that came crashing down in December of 2001, when Kathleen apparently fell to her death in their secluded home in an exclusive area of Durham, North Carolina. A dramatic trial followed in the explosive final chapter of a life that no novelist could ever have conceived... (American)



John GLATT Depraved

A True Story of Sadistic Murder in the Heartland. John Edward Robinson was 56-year-old а grandfather from rural Kansas. An entrepreneur and Eagle Scout, he was even honoured as Man of the Year at a Kansas City charity.



Masquerading as a philanthropist, he promised women money and adventure. For 15 years, he trawled the Web, snaring unsuspecting victims. They were never seen again. But in the summer of 2000, the decomposed remains of two women were discovered in barrels on Robinson's farm, and three other bodies were found in storage units. Yet the depths of Robinson's bloodlust did not end there. For authorities, the unspeakable criminal trail of Slavemaster was just beginning... (British)

Spies, Traitors and the Real Forces behind World Events. The author is a recently retired British Colonel who argues that Military Intelligence - not prostitution - is the world's oldest profession, although

the two often overlap. From the prostitute in Jericho who hid Joshua's spies, to the infamous KGB 'honey traps' that ensnared CIA agents, ladies of the night appear with salacious frequency in spy history. Secret intelligence networks were the key to success for all the great statesmen and generals from Caesar and Genghis Khan to Cardinal Richelieu and George Washington. With radio, telephone and email, the mechanics of espionage have been transformed. The vast agencies spawned by the Cold War have now been reinvented for the 'war on terror'. Against this history of espionage, the Hughes-Wilson investigates "monumental intelligence failure" of 9/11 and describes the progress of the undercover war against Al Qaida. A riveting read. Helen MacDONALD Human Remains

Episodes in human dissection. Bone collecting, body snatching and the politics of the trade in human remains are a gothic tale still h a u n t i n g contemporary life. This book tells the scandalous story of

how medical men



obtained the corpses upon which they worked before anatomy was regulated in Australia and Britain. Moving back and forth between Britain and the island penal colony of Tasmania, the book examines an era when convicted murderers received the double sentence of both death and dissection; the poor who died in hospital were routinely turned over to the surgeons for study; and men traded in human remains, including those of Aboriginal people. Helen MacDonald is an award-winning historian and Postdoctoral Fellow at the Australian Centre. University of Melbourne. (Australian)

Damian MARRETT Undercover



Damian Marrett was just 19 years of age when he joined the Victoria Police in 1986 as a somewhat reluctant recruit. Four years down the track, he was handpicked to work in a covert capacity for the Drug Squad. A further six years

working undercover, and Marrett had played a major role in up to 50 operations. The young detective was responsible for some of the biggest drug busts in Australian law enforcement history. His previously infiltration of the impenetrable Griffith Mafia, codenamed Operation Afghan, is still regarded as Australia's most complex covert sting operation. It lasted for an exhausting nine months and throughout that time Marrett was compelled to stay in character as knockabout drug dealer Ben Gleeson. Not only did he have the bad guys under surveillance, the bad guys were returning the favour in kind. After months of subterfuge, Afghan concluded in a tense stand-off in country NSW. Marrett's penetrating yet darkly comic insights into undercover work reveal a style of policing that is often shrouded in secrecy. Told with grim humour and astonishing candour, this is Marrett's own remarkable story. (Australian)

On 6 December 1991, fresh-faced teens Jennifer Harbison and Eliza Thomas began to close up the Austin, Texas yogurt shop where they worked. They were joined by Jennifer's younger sister Sarah and her friend Amy Ayers. Less than an hour later, all four girls were dead, apparently the victims of a fire. But closer examination revealed that they had been bound and gagged, sexually assaulted and executed. It was the most horrific crime the peaceful college town had seen since the infamous University of Texas tower shootings in 1966. (American)

In and out of hospitals since birth, angelic nine-month-old Morgan Reid finally succumbed to Sudden Infant Death Syndrome. Morgan's Texas-born mother Tanya, a nurse and devoted wife, pulled up stakes with her grieving husband Jim and moved on. It was the best way to put the past behind them. Until their son Michael, a boy who by all accounts was terrified of his mother, began showing signs of the same affliction that stole the life of his baby sister. First, the suspicion: Munchausen Syndrome by Proxy. Then, Tanya was charged and convicted with felony child abuse of her son. She was later tried and ultimately convicted for first degree murder of Morgan. It would become a landmark trial that unfolded in a series of reversals and bizarre twists of

fate as it gradually revealed another side of Tanya Reid, of her own troubling childhood and the dark secrets that drove a woman to the cruellest deception of all... (American)

Police Stories by those who have lived them. After September 11, 2001, Las Vegas Police Sergeant Randy Sutton began soliciting writing from law enforcement officers. His goal? To bridge the gap between the police and those they serve, with a book that offers a broad and thoughtful look at the many facets of police life. Hundreds of active and former officers responded from all over the United States. Sutton culled the selections into five categories: The Beat, Line of Duty, War Stories, Officer Down and Ground Zero. This is the result, a collection of funny,

charming, exciting and haunting stories about murder investigations, missing children, bungling burglars, car chases, lonely and desperate shut-ins, routine traffic stops, officers killed in the line of duty, and the life-changing events of September 11. In these stories, the heart and soul behind the badge shines through in unexpected ways and may help change the way we think about the deeply human realm of police service. (American)

McCay & Marie VERNON Deadly Lust



346pp Pb 16.95 29 November 1988, Anita Stevens climbed into a stranger's vehicle, thinking to turn a quick trick to fund her drug habit. She was the first to die. Over the next six years, six more prostitutes would fall victim to the same phantom killer, slain by gun, blunt objects, a strangler's noose - and the murderer's bare hands. His signature was the obscene poses in which he arranged his half-nude victims. Frustrated by false confessions, investigators sifted through a myriad of suspects until a murder in Asheville, North Carolina led them to the real killer - William Darrell Lindsey. Twice-married, a father of five, Lindsey had drifted across the South for years. Wherever

he went, rape and murder followed. He admitted to seven sex slayings, but experts believe that the death toll was somewhere between 12 and 20. Here is the chilling true story of a fiend whose sadistic lust was the most depraved addiction of all. (American)
