# Kerry GREENWOOD Queen of the Flowers Pb \$19.95

With a dash of glamour and serious helpings of style, the debonair Phryne Fisher returns, in her 14th escapade, as St Kilda's 'Queen of Flowers'. Upsetting the festivities though, is Phryne's adopted daughter Ruth, who has disappeared. And Phryne must find her amongst the yachters, millionaires, thieves and prostitutes who flourish at the carnival. Another wonderful delight that I enjoyed immensely. Also being reissued with this new book is **Ruddy Gore** (19.95), the 7th in the series. (Kerry Greenwood will attend The Sydney Writers' Festival this month.)



## Peter CORRIS The Coast Road Pb \$19.95

Frederick Farmer died when his weekender burned to the ground. Death by accident, the police found, but not so Cliff Hardy, especially when the sole beneficiary is a rich young widow. But just as Hardy is diving deep into the mire, he receives a panic-stricken call from Marisha Karatsky, an exotic, dark-eyed interpreter who has gotten well and truly under Hardy's battered guard. This is the 27th in this long running series and another pleasure I found to read. (Note: I do from time to time receive proof copies of advance titles, hence my comments).

Intelligence Personality with a mind like Miss Marple and hardware that hides a suspiciously human heart. Of course, it is hard to do legwork without legs, so when her human colleague Rav is murdered, she will have to think fast and



rely on the help of her friends. But when the almost sentient, mainframe sleuth recognises an enemy within the walls of her lab, she realises that whatever was after Ray might well have her on its hit list too. (American)



# Sarah ANDREWS

Killer Dust336pp Pb 15.95A mystery featuring forensic geologist Em Hansen. With its suspenseful story that begins in a cloud of dust and leads all the way to NASA, this is another topnotch mystery full of the impeccably researched popular science and the complex, engaging characters Sarah Andrews's many fans have come to expect from her award-winning series. (American)

# Jennifer APODACA Dying to Meet You

304pp Pb 13.95

Shaw Α Samantha *mystery*. The irrepressible owner of the Heart Mates Dating Service knows love can be tough. Even tougher is turning up at the home of her ex-client Fave Miller just in time to find Faye's dead body. The scene gets worse when arrogant Detective Logan Vance arrives with the newspapers and Sam's own bad-boy amor PI Gabe Pulizzi tries to muscle in on the action. In between dodging assassination attempts and tangling with Vance, Sam needs to find a lead she can run with before she loses her business, her boyfriend and maybe her life. (American)

# Skyscraper (1931)

269pp Tp 27.95 First published in the same year the Empire State Building opened its doors, this novel marks the advent of a new kind of romance plot and a new kind of heroine. Like so many young women protagonists before her, Lynn faces choices that will determine the course and quality of the rest of her life. Sexual bargains and betravals, insider trades, financial manoeuvres and legal shenanigans make this great pulp fiction from the Femmes Fatales imprint of the Feminist Press. (American)

# Anthony BERKELEY

The Poisoned Chocolates Case (1936) 233pp Tp 25.95 Print-on-Demand series. A journalist as well as a novelist, Anthony Berkeley was a founding member of the Detection Club and one of crime fiction's greatest innovators. He was one of the first to predict the development of the psychological' crime novel and he sometimes wrote under the pseudonym of Francis Iles. He wrote 24 novels, 10 of which feature his amateur detective, Roger Sheringham. In this, Sheringham investigates his most famous case: When Joan Bendix makes a bet with her husband for a box of chocolates: no one imagines that winning will cost her her life. The Sheringham Crime Circle finds the unusual case baffling, but eventually come up with some very interesting theories, which they then proceed to disprove one by one. (English)

One summer day Clara Marshall vanished without trace. A few days later, her children also disappeared and were never seen again. Richard, her heartbroken husband, claimed his wife was having an affair with an Australian backpacker and that she had run away with him, destroying the family forever. That was 27 years ago. John Kelly, veteran journalist, covered the case when he was a trainee reporter and he suspected something far more sinister. Police enquiries discovered no Australian backpacker. DS Karen Meadows, familiar with case since childhood, is only too aware that many suspect Marshall of murdering his wife and children. But where are the bodies? (English)

A Fethering mystery. Bracketts, an Elizabethan house near Fethering, is about to be turned into a museum. Once the home of celebrated poet Esmund Chadleigh, it will become a shrine to his life and poetry. But the transition from house to museum is running far from smoothly, because buried in the kitchen garden is a human skeleton. And before too long, there is a second body, not yet cold. Murder is no longer just a dreadful possibility, but a certainty. It is a case that will test the sleuthing powers of Board member Carole Seddon and her friend Jude as never before. (English)

# Suzanne BROCKMANN

Gone too Far 536pp Pb 15.95 In her sizzling, award-winning novels of suspense, Brockmann delves into the adrenaline-rushed world of counter terrorism and taps into the real passions of its brave men and women. In this novel she spins a story of action, intrigue and romance, as a US Navy SEAL and an FBI agent race to unravel a mystery while confronting their own unresolved feelings for each other. (American)

# **Digital Fortress (1998)**

510pp Pb 19.95

When the National Security Agency's code-breaking machine invincible encounters a code it cannot break, the agency calls in its head cryptographer Susan Fletcher, a brilliant, beautiful mathematician. What she uncovers sends shock waves through the corridors of power. The NSA is being held hostage by a code so complex that, if released, would cripple US intelligence. Caught in an accelerating tempest of secrecy and lies, Fletcher battles to save the agency she believes in. By the author of The Da Vinci Code (Pb 19.95). (American)

Crimson Hit 301pp Pb 13.95 This is the first book in a new series starring San Diego's top bounty hunter, Dev Shannon. Too bad his latest assignment is personal. Drug kingpin Julio Sanchez has taken out one of Dev's oldest friends and before he can do anything about it, Dev will have to clear up two other cases. Some quality time with Google (the bail enforcer's best friend), some moral support from his Siamese cat Futa and the usual bit of dirty pool should do the trick! (American)

### Chester D CAMPBELL Secret of the Scroll â

### 243pp Tp 26.95

Retired US Air Force OSI agent Greg McKenzie thinks his troubles with the Metro Nashville Police are a problem until he brings a souvenir Dead Sea Scroll home from the Holy Land and things go from bad to worse. A Palestinian terrorist group invades his home, taking his wife Jill hostage. He finds himself with an ancient Hebrew scroll worth millions, wanted by both the Palestinians and a radical far-right Israeli organisation. When he tries to exchange it for Jill's freedom, everything goes wrong. The scroll has a secret with calamitous possibilities in the wrong hands. (American)

### Suzanne CHAZIN

307pp Pb 15.95 🛊 Fireplay After a fire kills two of New York's bravest, Georgia Skeehan is forced to collaborate with an arsonist-turned-FBI informant; a man she believes is a master 'torch'. As Georgia is drawn deep undercover, the truth (and her own desire for vengeance) brings her closer to a killer. Close enough to burn. (American)

# Lee CHILD

The Enemy

Lee Child's new stomach-churning, 412pp Tp 32.95 palm-sweating thriller turns back the

clock to Jack Reacher's army days. For the first time we meet a younger Reacher, a Reacher not yet disillusioned with military life. A Reacher with family. A Reacher in dog tags and starched uniform who imposes army discipline, if only in his own pragmatic way. A Reacher as far from the no-credit card, no-last-knownaddress drifter of the previous eight novels as is possible to imagine. With the Berlin Wall coming down, the US army is under pressure to downsize. Jack Reacher is the duty Military Police officer on a base in North Carolina when he takes a call reporting a dead soldier. The body was found in a sleazy motel used by local hookers. Reacher tells the local cop to handle it; it sounds like the guy just had a heart attack. But the dead man turns out to have been a two-star general on a secret mission. (English)

### Lee CHILD 🇯 Persuader

Never forgive, never forget. That is Jack Reacher's standard operating procedure. And Francis Xavier Quinn was the worst guy he had ever met. He had done truly unforgivable things. So Reacher was glad to know he was dead. Until the day he saw him, alive and well, riding in a limousine outside Boston's Symphony Hall. Never apologise. Never explain. When Reacher witnesses a brutal attempt to kidnap a terrified young student on a New England campus, he takes the law into his own hands. Has he lost his sense of right and wrong? Just because this time, it is personal? (English) Mary Higgins CLARK

The Second Time Round 302pp Pb 16.95 Nicholas Spencer, charismatic head of the medical research company Gen-Stone, involved in the development of an anticancer vaccine, suddenly disappears. His private plane crashes but his body is not found. Rocking the financial and medical world even more comes the shocking revelation that Spencer had looted Gen-Stone of huge sums of money and that his wife Lynn is accused of having participated in the scam. Narrowly escaping death when her mansion is set on fire, Lynn turns to her stepsister Carley, a columnist for the Wall Street Weekly, to help prove that she was not her husband's accomplice. Is Nicholas Spencer dead or in hiding? Was he guilty or set up? And as the facts begin to unfold, she becomes the focus of a dangerous group involved in a sinister and fraudulent scheme. (American)

The Poet (1996) 480pp Pb 9.95 This specially priced edition contains an exclusive extract from its soon-to-be-released sequel, The Narrows (Tp 29.95). The Poet is a brutal and sadistic serial killer who specialises in killing cops. Harry Bosch is a cop who specialises in catching serial killers. James Lee Burke said this novel is "one of the most authentic pieces of crime writing" he has ever read. (English)

300 years ago, the settlers on the island of Sanctuary were betrayed by one of their own and slaughtered. Now, a

# **Clive CUSSLER**

Golden Buddha 420pp Hb 49.95 × The creator of the bestselling NUMA and Dirk Pitt series introduces his latest high-seas action hero: the enigmatic captain of the Oregon, Juan Cabrillo. Only Cabrillo could convert the interior of a nondescript lumber hauler into a state-ofthe-art spy ship and only he could take the helm on the dangerous covert missions it carries out for whatever US agency pays the price. In his first featurelength adventure, it is up to Cabrillo and his crew of expert intelligence and naval men to put Tibet back in the hands of the Dalai Lama by striking a deal with the Russians and the Chinese. His gambling chip is a golden Buddha containing records of vast oil reserves in the disputed land. But first he will have to locate and steal the all-important artefact. Carver gets a call from his provocative and gorgeous colleague Miranda when their friend Lenny dies during a computer game, and a strange narrative unfolds around a possible murder and a huge insurance fraud. # 334pp Pb 15.95

Maggie O'Brien is tough. She has to be, as a tactical emergency medic for the St Louis SWAT team and a trauma nurse at Blymore Memorial. As the daughter of a violent ex-cop, she prefers wits over weapons. Just before a psychotic



former FBI agent known as Montana Bob dies in the ER from superficial wounds following a botched standoff, he reveals a secret about Blymore. It is called The List, a chillingly precise run-down of expendable citizens and patients. And one by one, under Maggie's care, they are dying from inexplicable causes. Who is framing Maggie? (American)

# **Rod DUNCAN**

### 402pp Pb 18.95

🛓 Breakbeat Daz Croxley is an unemployable, inner-city dwelling, retro-punk who is illiterate because of dyslexia but possessed of his own peculiar intelligence. Struggling to pay off his corrupt landlord, Daz loots an electronics shop during an inner-city riot. Included in his bounty are a handful of sequentially numbered 20-pound notes. This money comes from a vastly larger hoard, the product of a fraudulent property deal, a hoard for which men have already died. When word leaks out that Daz knows the location of the money, the lives of his few real friends are in peril. His only hope is to play his pursuers off against each other in a deadly game of bluff and double bluff. (English)

# The Eighth Circle (1958) 295pp Pb 19.95

Crime Masterworks series #35. Murray Kirk runs his private investigation agency like the business it is: he isn't interested in justice or crusades, just the profit and loss account. When he's asked to act for a young policeman accused of bribery, because he knows something about police corruption in New York City, he isn't too keen. He just can't see the profit - until he meets the man's fiancée. And motives then Kirk's become uncomfortably confused, and he finds himself descending swiftly into a grey world of bookmakers, gangsters, grafters and corrupt politicians, a world where setting up an honest cop is all in a day's work. (American)

# Linda FAIRSTEIN

The Bone Vault 470pp Pb 19.95 Linda Fairstein takes us behind the scenes of some of New York's magnificent and mysterious institutions in her most electrifying Alexandra Cooper thriller yet. It begins in the glorious Temple of Dendur at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, where wealthy donors have gathered to hear plans for a controversial new exhibit. An uneasy mix of scholarship and showbiz, the exhibition has raised fierce opposition from some of the museum's elite: IMAX time trips and Rembrandt refrigerator magnets have no place for them at the Met. Assistant DA Cooper, off duty for the evening, observes the proceedings with bemused interest until the Met director suddenly pulls her aside; the body of a young researcher has been in an ancient Egyptian found sarcophagus. Teaming up with cops, Alex must penetrate the silent sentinels comprising New York's museum society to find a killer. (American)

### The Small Boat of Great Sorrows 458pp Pb 19.95 $\circ$

Fesperman is a reporter for the Baltimore Sun and worked in its Berlin bureau during the years of civil war in former Yugoslavia, as well as in Afghanistan during the recent conflict. His first novel, Lie in the Dark (Pb 19.95), won the CWA John Creasey award for best first crime novel in 1999 and this, his second novel won the 2003 CWA Steel Dagger for Thriller of the Year. Vlado Petric, former detective in war-torn Sarajevo, has left his beloved homeland to join his wife and daughter in Germany. When Calvin Pine, who works for the International War Crimes Tribunal, tells Petric that they want him to go to The Hague, it doesn't take Petric long to accept, especially when Pine tells him they are after a big fish: one of the men who they think is responsible for the terrible massacre of Srebrenica. What Petric doesn't know is that he is also being used as bait to lure into the open a murderer from the previous generation; a man whose activities in the Second World War makes the current generation of killers look like amateurs. (American)

### **Jessica FLETCHER & Donald BAIN** Murder, She Wrote #20 22

260pp Pb 15.95 Dying to Retire. Jessica Fletcher is in a Florida retirement community for the funeral of a dear old friend whose heart gave out, only to discover that the woman's death from natural causes might have been artificially induced. With the help of a feisty group of youngin-spirit retirees, Jessica must track down the clues and find out who prescribed the fatal treatment. (American)

Α Benni Harper mystery #10. Spirited ex-cowgirl, quilter and folk-art expert Benni Harper is investigating the connection between her favourite author, the murder of a family friend and a quilt. And crazv when she starts receiving strange



phone calls and anonymous letters telling her she will be the next victim, her interest in the case becomes even more urgent. (American)

### Kathryn FOX

Malicious Intent 345pp Tp 30.00 A Dr Anya Crichton mystery #1. This debut novel by Sydney doctor Kathryn Fox is a compelling read. At a meet-theauthor function for Jeffrey Deaver she happened to ask some pertinent questions and he was so taken with her that he offered to be her mentor. The result is this novel, starring forensic physician Anya Crichton, the only freelancer in the field. She has all the normal problems of the professional classes: paying child support and a mortgage, while struggling to get her business off the ground. Like Gabrielle Lord, author Fox is compelled to mull over serial sex crimes against women. In this example, however, much attention is paid to Lebanese patriarchies, social worker psychologists and vulnerable and virginal young women. The first three quarters of the novel are great but the denouement could have been prolonged to build suspense. All over, however, I really liked the Sydney setting, the major female players (especially DS Kate Farrer) and the killer's comeuppance. - Shelley (Australian)

One interview soon raises unresolved questions about a recent murder and Rona's investigative antennae are instantly on the alert. (English)



# Joseph GEARY

For six years, Nicholas Greer has been working on a biography of the late British painter, Frank Spira. Then comes the call that changes his life forever. Former art critic Barb Segal informs him that she has just bumped into Spira's ex-lover, Jacob Grossman, who disappeared in 1972 and has never been seen since, until now. When Nick tracks him down in New York, Grossman mentions a mysterious painting, The Incarnation, which Spira was alleged to have painted in Tangier in the late 1950s. If it exists, this painting would be worth over US\$6m. An hour after this meeting, Grossman is brutally murdered. A prime suspect in the ensuing police investigation, Nick's only hope of proving his innocence is to find out the truth about The Incarnation. What exactly happened in Tangier in 1957? And just who is the sinister Collector who is shadowing Nick? The truth about Spira's elusive masterpiece is more horrific, more shocking than Nick could ever have imagined. (English)

📥 The Havana Room 385pp Tp 29.95 Bill Wyeth is a successful real-estate attorney in his late 30s with a wife and son, who, by the merest chance, loses everything: family, job and social status. Restoration seems unlikely, redemption impossible, when Wyeth finds himself in an old-time Manhattan steakhouse. The manager, Allison Sparks, sexv. complicated and independent in all ways, intrigues him. She also controls access to the restaurant's private bar. This is the Havana Room, and what goes on in there, he is told, is secret. Wyeth agrees to help Jay Rainey conclude a last-minute, midnight real-estate transaction. As soon as he sees the players and the paperwork, he knows something is wrong. When Wyeth is finally admitted to the Havana Room, the survival of its inhabitants is most uncertain. (American)

# J M HAYES

Prairie Gothic 264pp Pb 15.95 A Poisoned Pen Press mystery. Benteen County, Kansas, is a hellhole in summer under scorching heat and winds but turns even meaner in winter. As a howling blizzard blows, Sheriff English is presented with a missing doll and a dead baby? Switched, but by whom? And why? The elderly coroner disclaims any knowledge, but seems faintly uneasy, especially when the swastika on the tiny corpse is revealed. Meanwhile, the sheriff's half-brother Harvey Edward Maddox, known as Mad Dog for his invocation of his Amerindian heritage, has picked up a naked dead body from the Sunshine Towers retirement home and is heading towards a treetop burial when diverted by the storm. In a makeshift mound nearby, Mad Dog's pet hybrid-wolf finds a child's skull and evidence of mature bones as well as a fading ID for a living County Supervisor. Can the Hornbaker clan really be as gothic as it seems? And what of the tiny woman in the red shoes back at the Towers who calls herself Dorothy, underlying an odd note of Oz. (American)

Alex goes undercover as a flight attendant to infiltrate the group. But when her cover is blown, she knows it is only a matter of time before her next flight is her last. (American)

# 🛓 In a Lonely Place (1947)

250pp Tp 27.95 This is a classic noir tale of American machismo gone mad and the book that inspired the famous 1950 film starring Humphrey Bogart. The setting is post-WW2 Los Angeles where the golden promise of Southern California is running headlong into bleak reality for local residents. Returning veterans face a crisis of identity and masculinity while the wide boulevards and dark canyons of the city have become hunting grounds for a serial killer who preys on young working girls waiting alone in bars or at lonely bus stops. Hardboiled mystery writer Dorothy Hughes employs a bold narrative strategy, writing from inside the mind of a man who may himself be the murderer. (American)

Putt to Death 256pp Pb 13.95 A Golf Lover's mystery. Touring progolfer Cassie Burdette stumbles over the body of a club member who was trying to turn a posh Connecticut country club into an environmentally friendly, Jack-and-Jill domain. It is then that she realises that golf can be a contact sport. (American)

It is a tale of corruption and organised crime, where politicians are sold to the highest bidder and where real power lies with the Mafia and other US interests. It describes a Havana dominated by drug trafficking, gambling and prostitution. A highly readable but rigorous study of a fascinating period of history from 1934 to 1958, this book uses both Cuban and US sources to document the intertwined relationships between Washington, the pre-revolution Mafia and the governments in Cuba. (Cuban)

### **Elizabeth GEORGE** Write Away 296pp Tp 34.95

One Novelist's Approach to Fiction and the Writing Life. This is an inspiring template for any would-be author of fiction from one of the world's most successful crime writers. Sharing her wealth of experience, Elizabeth George illustrates her points about plot, characterisation and technique with extracts from her own and other author's work. She has a concise and wonderful teaching style, making the whole process sound much easier than it is. (English)

### John GLATT **Deadly American Beauty** 292pp Pb 15.95

A true story of passion, adultery and Greg murder. DeVillers was a top biotech executive, and Kristen Rossum was embarking on a career in toxicology at the San Diego Medical Examiner's office. But only



second anniversary, Kristen found her handsome husband dead from a drug overdose, his corpse sprinkled with rose petals. By his side was their wedding photo. "If our leaders manage only one book this year, they could do a lot worse than pick up Phillip Knightley's and discover what imbecilities are committed in the hallowed name of intelligence." This slap in the face comment is how John Le Carre thinks of this profession, which was bureaucratised with the creation of Her Majesty's Secret Intelligence Service in dubious circumstances in 1909. Other countries followed, until no country considered itself a nation until it had a corps of spies. In assessing the real role of the spy, the author answers crucial questions. Did they make any difference to the course of history? Or was spying the biggest confidence trick of all time? This is a revised version of the original 1986 edition and has a new introduction. (English)

## Thomas MAURELLIO & Ann DARBY The Dollhouse Murders 165pp Hb 34.95

A forensic expert investigates six little crimes. The doll is dead. Did Ken do it? These stories of miniature crimes are illustrated in gorgeous colour photographs to reveal real CSI t e c h n i q u e s. Thomas Mauriello



has been teaching modern CSI techniques for 26 years. Now, he uses his tried and tested crime scene dioramas to bring the science of modern crime investigation to everyone. Each of his six miniature crime scene dioramas contains clues to preliminarily determine cause of death accident, suicide or homicide. A large photo of the dollhouse scene including murder weapons, victims, obvious clues and red herrings introduces each crime. The text, written by award-winning journalist Ann Darby, takes the reader through what the detective learns when he arrives at the scene, to the key questions and clues, and then, finally, to the investigator's explanation of what really happened. After the first wideangle photo, five follow-up photos focus on key clues spreading out through the remaining chapter. (American)
