The Chapel of Bones (334pp Pb 18.95)



Coming in June is the 18th in the wonderful series featuring Sir Baldwin Furnshill and Bailiff Simon Puttock. 40 years ago, Exeter Cathedral Close rang to the clamour of weapons, shouts of defiance and screams of pain. Afterwards, the bodies lying in their own blood bore silent witness to the conflicts that were tearing at the heart of the Cathedral itself. Today, in 1323, more deaths have occurred. Is the first an accident? The second is surely murder, brutal and foul. Once again, vicious slaying has polluted the Cathedral Close, but this time the killer will not be so easy to capture and execute. The victim, Henry Potell, a wealthy saddler, was feared and hated – he held secrets that some were keen to keep hidden, while others wanted him destroyed for his savage deeds all those years ago. For Sir Baldwin and Simon, the truth is increasingly mysterious. Who among Henry Potell's companions could have wanted him dead? Was it someone whose ties to Potell are dark and sinister? What first appears to be a matter of lust or greed soon grows much more troubling as Baldwin becomes aware of the disturbing and ominous Chapel of Bones, built long ago in reparation for a terrible murder.

The Butcher of St Peter's (416pp Hb 59.95)

Also coming in June is the 19th in the series. When a merchant in Exeter hears an intruder in his home one night, his first thought is to conceal his adulterous lover. But then he witnesses a sinister figure stooping over the bed of his only child, a figure who almost seems to vanish into thin air. Two years on and the identity of the intruder has become common knowledge: the idiot of the city who lost his own children many years ago, and who seems doomed to wander the town searching for them. But when a boy disappears, suspicion immediately falls on him. The local constable is determined to solve the mystery, as his own son disappeared some years ago and he always suspected the fool. Sir Baldwin is asked to follow a lead to the manor of Bishop's Clyst to find out what happened. While he is there, a body is found under the stone bridge – the body of a boy, but not the one who recently went missing.

All the earlier titles in the series, set in the 14th century, are available and if you haven't tried Michael Jecks then you have a treat in store. Giles BLUNT **Black Fly Season** -

372pp Tp 29.95 This the third atmospheric is psychological thriller featuring detectives Cardinal and Delorme, from the awardwinning author of Forty Words for Sorrow (Pb 18.95). It is early summer in Algonquin Bay and the black flies are not the only ones out for blood. Someone is trying to kill a young red-haired woman, who after being shot in the head with a small-calibre weapon cannot remember her own name or where she is from, let alone why anyone would want to hurt her. Then a body turns up, horribly mutilated. Wombat Guthrie, biker and drug dealer, has taken his last ride. It seems inconceivable that the two cases could be linked, but as detectives Cardinal and Delorme pursue their investigations the name 'Red Bear' keeps cropping up. An Iroquois shaman, Red Bear, has recently moved into the drug trade, enlisting the aid of the spirit world to direct his followers to rival gangs' drugs and money. In return, the 'spirits' demand sacrifice - human sacrifice. (Canadian)

The God of Chaos

405pp Tp 32.95 Cairo in June 1942 is a city blistering under the lash of a relentless summer and panicked by the implacable advance of Hitler's most talented general, Erwin Rommel. It is the worst possible time and place for the body of a senior British officer to be found in a rubbish bin, bathed in blood. His murder has been made to look like a political assassination by local extremists opposed to British rule, but former New York cop Joe Quinn senses more fundamental human emotions at play. His investigation leads him to the heart of Cairo's high command and the possibility that a highly placed spy is feeding the allies' most sensitive secrets to Rommel. (British)

The Hopwicke Country House Hotel, owned by Jude's glamorous friend Suzy Longthorne, is to host an event for the allmale society, The Pillars of Sussex. On the night, Jude helps Suzy serve dinner, and in the early hours of the morning they watch with relief as the guests drag themselves to their beds. The next morning, one young solicitor does not come down for breakfast. Jude heads for Nigel Ackford's room, presuming he is feeling the effects of the night before. It soon becomes apparent, however, that Nigel has been spared his hangover. For Jude finds him hanging from the beams of his four-poster bed... (British)

The Assassin 357pp Pb 16.95 Selena McCaffrey knows what it is like to fight for your life, to hone your body until it is sharp and to never let down your guard for anyone. With a 40calibre Smith & Wesson and a doubleedged dagger packed in her bags, she is going to kill a man. 14 years ago, a chance encounter plunged her into the grasp of criminal mastermind William Davis, who became her protector and twisted fatherfigure. Now William has ordered her to move in next door to a Tulsa cop investigating a triple homicide. A man of quiet strength, Detective Tony Ceola is closer than he knows to bringing down William's criminal empire. (American)

Andrea CAMILLERI Excursion to Tindari

293pp Tp 27.00

An Inspector Montalbano mystery. Andrea Camilleri's savvy and darkly comic take on Sicilian life leads Montalbano into his most bone-chilling case yet. In two seemingly unrelated crimes, a young Don Juan is found murdered and an elderly couple is reported missing after an excursion to the ancient site of Tindari. As Montalbano works to solve both cases, he stumbles onto Sicily's ghastly new age of brutal and anonymous criminality. (Italian)

Massimo CARLOTTO The Master of Knots

184pp Tp 29.95

Alligator is a former blues singer and exconvict and now a PI, who finds himself pulled into a dark and unsettling case that uncovers an Italy known to very few. When Helena Giraldi is abducted, her husband approaches Alligator and his friends for help. Helena and Mariano lead a secret double life involving Italy's clandestine S&M scene. But Mariano seems more worried about losing his job and reputation than about seeing his wife again. As more members of the underground scene start to disappear, Alligator's team find themselves in a race against time to reveal the true identity of The Master of Knots. (Italian)

There is, however, something uneasy in the air: one woman in the group, Alison Kenall, a beautiful, high-powered Hollywood agent, died just a few days before, drowned in her pool during an early morning swim. She is the fifth woman in the class whose life has come to a sudden, mysterious end. (American)

The murderer is known as Van Gogh. Leaving a bloody trail of bodies up and down the east coast. every one of the serial killer's targets receives gruesome his signature: the removal of the victim's right ear. After 10 such



bodies, the FBI tracks him down and takes him out, putting an end to a horrific mystery. For Boston attorney Jimmy Morrissey, however, Van Gogh's death is only the beginning. Things get worse when two FBI agents let him in on a chilling piece of evidence found in Van Gogh's apartment: a beautiful woman's headshot, with Morrisey's name and address on the back, a message from beyond the grave. Is life just one big computer game? This highoctane debut novel has the energy of a Tarantino film, the game-playing of The Matrix and the philosophical guirkiness of Fight Club. Nothing quite like it has come out of Russia before. It has been picked up by publishers around the world and now looks set to be an international cult novel. (Russian)

Elizabeth GEORGE With No One as Witness

584pp Tp 32.95 The new Inspector Lynley mystery. Elizabeth George creates a serial killer for the first time, setting the globally popular Inspector Lynley his most shocking case yet. When the Metropolitan Police fail to realise a serial killer is at work, London ignites over the fact that the killer's victims are young, black and mixed race boys. Institutionalised prejudice is claimed by the community's activists and tabloids alike. Lynley is given the case, and his Scotland Yard task force is soon handling more killings and a looming tragedy. (American)

Archaeologist Jack Howard is a brave but cautious man. When he embarked on a new search for buried treasure in the Mediterranean, he knew it was a long shot. It is a somewhat uneasy partnership; things are never quite what they seem and people are never quite who they say they are, yet the threesome manage to keep each other's secrets from the public with a fair degree of success and spindoctoring. Then Yana is sent a series of threatening letters from an extremely well-informed, anonymous source.

Suspicion of betrayal turns to fear, which in turn leads to murder. The perils of ambition are as dangerously twisted as those who aspire to love and be loved in this darkling tale. - Cara
