

From such a simple beginning does a most complex case develop as Brunetti leads us through the maze of Murano glass-blowing society, toxic waste-dumping, murder and, of course, the pettiest of local politics. Donna BALL Smoky Mountain Tracks

267pp Pb 16.95 A Raine Stockton Dog Mystery. North Carolina native Raine Stockton, a dog trainer and the ex-wife of a deputy sheriff, knows the woods of Hanover County as well as anyone. She stopped volunteering for Search and Rescue work after a tragic loss, but now reluctantly returns to active duty - along with a young and inexperienced Golden Retriever named Cisco - to help find a mother and six-year-old girl who have been kidnapped and taken deep into the wilderness. Suspecting there is more to the case than meets the eye, Raine must struggle to overcome her personal demons, turn her search in new directions and learn to trust Cisco to lead the way. (American)

Robert BARNARD A Cry From the Dark

282pp Pb 19.95 Bettina Whitelaw. Approaching 80, with a beautiful flat in Holland Park and a comfortable income, Bettina's life is not dissimilar to that of her wealthy, elegant neighbours. Brought up in Bundaroo, a small town in the Australian outback, her childhood was dominated by the relentlessly blazing sun, the long daily walk to school, and by the simmering animosities of small-town life. Aged 16, Bettina managed to escape to begin her literary career in Europe. But now, more than 60 years later, her past is coming back to haunt her. As she embarks upon the painful process of writing her memoirs, images from her childhood begin to resurface. And when her former housekeeper is the victim of a violent attack, Bettina begins to realise that she is in serious danger - a danger that has its roots in a small, dusty outback town. (English)

402pp Pb 18.95 After an embezzlement conviction, David Hirsch is eager to rebuild his law career. But a new investigation reveals a conspiracy of corruption and coldblooded murder that could prove his downfall - or total redemption. (American)



Dog Eat Dog 341pp Pb 16.95 *A Melanie Travis Mystery.* When money turns up missing from the exclusive Belle Haven Kennel Club and one of the members is found dead in a parking lot, Melanie Travis - teacher, single parent and proud owner of Faith, a rambunctious Standard Poodle pup finds herself moving closer to a killer desperate enough to strike again. 🜻 See Isabelle Run 🛛 278pp Pb 16.95 Dumped by her fiancé for her maid of honour 22 minutes before walking down the aisle (not to mention being stuck with an apartment lease she can't afford), Isabelle doesn't jump from the nearest window. She dances on the tables at her almost-wedding reception and takes a job at Becky Belden Multimedia, a design and lifestyle empire presided over by America's favourite homemaking guru. Even as she learns 600 ways to fold a napkin, Isabelle finds her dream job morphing into a nightmare when she discovers BBM's employees are dropping faster than an overcooked soufflé. (American)

Stephen BOOTH The Dead Place 597pp Pb 19.95

"It's perfectly simple. All you have to do is find the dead place." The anonymous caller who taunts the Police with talk of an imminent killing could be a hoaxer, his descriptions of death and decomposition a sick



fantasy. But Detective Diane Fry is certain she's dealing with a murderer. The voice - so eerily, shiveringly calm - invites the police to meet the 'flesh eater'. Fry fears it may already be too late to save the next victim. DC Ben Cooper, meanwhile, is looking into Derbyshire's first case of body snatching. The investigation takes him into the dark, secret world of those whose lives revolve around the dead and their disposal - from funeral directors to crematorium staff and a professor whose speciality is the study of death. Where is the dead place? And what terrible deeds are done there? (English)

Shock Wave 310pp Pb 18.95 Florida Department of Law Enforcement agent Bill Tasker, still smarting from a run-in with the FBI that almost got him killed, reluctantly teams up with the bureau again on a case involving a stolen Stinger missile. The op goes smoothly enough (though the feds take all the credit-what else is new?), but something about the whole setup just doesn't feel right. Tasker pokes around a bit and stirs up more trouble than a nest of rattlesnakes: with his boss, with the FBI, with the ATF, and, worst of all, with a certain gentleman who loves to see things blow up... In The Crush, when Dr Rennie Newton is summoned to jury duty, she brings to the courtroom the same level of competence that she displays in the operating room. Her commitment to precision compels her to deliver a 'not guilty' verdict in the murder case against notorious contract killer Ricky Lozada. It will be the most regrettable decision of her life ... 290pp Tp 32.95 Ireland, awash with cash and greed, no longer turns to the Church for solace and comfort. But the decapitation of Father Joyce in a Galway church brings a gasp to the most hardened cynics. Not to Jack Taylor. While Liebermann attempts to get to the bottom of the mystery, he must also decide whether to follow his father's advice and marry the beautiful, but reserved, Clara. (English)

Charles BRANDT "I Heard You Paint Houses": Frank 'The Irishman' Sheeran & Closing the Case on Jimmy Hoffa

The title comes from the first words Jimmy Hoffa ever spoke to Frank 'The Irishman' Sheeran. To paint a house is to kill a man. The paint is the blood that splatters on the walls and floor. As a boy, Sheeran took on older kids in bar fights ca big dad as



fights so his dad could win free beer. During WWII, he was a highly decorated infantryman with 411 days of active combat duty and a willingness to follow orders. He became a hustler and hit man, working for legendary crime boss Russell Bufalino and eventually becoming one of only two non-Italians on the FBI's famous La Cosa Nostra list. He was also a good friend of Jimmy Hoffa. When Hoffa disappeared in 1975, Sheeran became a leading suspect. For the first time, The Irishman tells all - a lifetime of payoffs (including hand-delivering bags of cash to Nixon's attorney general, John Mitchell) and manipulation (supporting Joe Biden's election to the Senate with a Teamster action) - for the book that became his deathbed confession. He died on 14 December 2003. (American)

Simon CRITTLE

The Last Godfather: The Rise and Fall of Joey Massino 256pp Pb 18.95

As head of the Bonanno clan, Joey Massino was the last don and ran his world with an iron hand, until he got hit with a murder rap and turned on his own people. Here, for the first time, is his shocking true story - a glimpse inside



the world of organised crime that we may never see again. (American)

Malcolm DODD & Beverly KNIGHT Justice for the Dead:

Forensic Pathology in the Hot Zone 306pp Pb 29.95

As an experienced forensic pathologist, Malcolm Dodd thought he was well hardened to almost any gruesome situation he might confront. But when he got to East Timor, they told him he would have to 'harden up'. They were right. Working calmly and steadily through the horrific aftermath of violence in East Timor, mass graves in Kosovo and the jungles of the Solomon Islands, Malcolm applies his forensic expertise to help bring justice and dignity to the dead, and to the loved ones left behind. (Australian)

Stephen DUNCOMBE The Bobbed Haired Bandit: A True Story of Crime and Celebrity in 1920s New York 381pp Hb 52.95

Ripped straight from the headlines of the Jazz Age, this is a tale of flappers and fast cars, of sex and morality. In the spring of 1924, a poor, 19-year-old laundress from Brooklyn robbed a string of New York grocery



stores with a baby automatic, a fur coat and a fashionable bobbed hairdo. Celia Cooney's crimes made national news, with the likes of Ring Lardner and Walter Lippman writing about her exploits for enthralled readers. (American)

Jim GREENHILL Someone Has to Die Tonight

445pp Pb 16.95 It was big news in Ft Myers, Florida when an abandoned historic building was destroyed by vandals in a spectacular blast. Behind it lay the Lords of Chaos, a band of teenage misfits led by Kevin Foster, 18, a vicious hatemonger who idolised Oklahoma City bomber Timothy McVeigh and was known as 'God' to his five-man gang. The explosion was only one episode in a month-long crime spree that began with vandalism and theft, escalating into what a local sheriff later called "a vortex of bloodlust and arson." The rampage culminated in the brutal shotgun murder of high school band director Mark Schwebes, 32. Police busted the gang before they could unleash a planned racist mass murder at Disney World, but their leader wasn't done yet... (American)

Damian MARRETT White Lies

244pp Tp 27.95

"You're a professional liar. You lie for a living." "They're only white lies. It's part of my job." The defence barrister stood still, measuring his next question before taking aim. "Can you give me an example of a white lie?" "Sure," I replied. "Me pretending that I'm a hit man when a criminal wants to kill someone." "You'd call that a white lie?" He almost laughed. "Yes, because it was intended to save a man's life." Marrett, author of the bestselling Undercover (Pb 27.95), returns with more tales from his days as a covert operative in the Victoria Police. This time around, he pits himself against drugdealing neo-Nazis, nude ecstasy freaks, Romanian heroin dealers, kidnappers with a bent for witchcraft and a drug-trafficking Olympian. Expect plenty of thrills, spills and underworld dills! (Australian)

Debbi MARSHALL Killing for Pleasure

A disused bank vault holding eight dismembered bodies immersed in barrels of acid. Two bodies buried in a suburban backyard. A further two found in the bush. Five years in the research, investigative journalist Debbi Marshall probes deep inside the sinister world of the killers and behind the veil of secrecy that shrouds Adelaide society in presenting the definitive account of the Snowtown serial murders. Informed by material never seen before - an interview with Bunting's last lover Elizabeth Harvey, and with the Crown's key eyewitness James Vlassakis, and with details of the torture and crimes not previously released - this is a tensely woven and microscopic examination of tawdry lives and tragic deaths. The BTK Murders

From 1974 to 1991, someone in the Midwestern city of Wichita was leaving behind slain, tortured bodies and anonymously proclaiming himself to police and reporters as 'BTK' (for Bind, Torture, Kill). For the next 14 years, BTK was silent.

But when he began sending letters again, investigators would not miss their chance... Stunningly, police arrested Dennis Rader, the president of his church board and the father of two. As a shocked community watched, evidence piled up. Then Rader coldly described how he went about "his projects" as the families of his victims relived the horrific scenes this supposed pillar of the community had unleashed on their loved ones. From the tricks he used to enter his victims' homes to the puzzles he sent the media and the key role his own daughter may have played in his arrest, this is the definitive story of the BTK killer. (American)

Steven WALKER **Blood Trail**

352pp Pb 14.95

On October 29, 1997, hooker Andrea "Slick" Hendrix's, beaten, naked body was discovered in a roadside ditch near Stewartsville, Indiana. With no leads for police to follow, the case eventually went cold, but it wouldn't stay that way. In 2003, sadistic sexual predator Joseph W Brown claimed to have strangled Hendrix with his favourite murder weapon - a shoelace from a woman's size-8 shoe. In 1977, Brown had been sentenced to life in prison for kidnapping and armed robbery. In 1995, he was released despite the fact that he'd beaten a fellow inmate nearly to death. Brown later confessed that during the next five years, he indulged in a seven-state rampage of torture and murder, his victims female hitchhikers and prostitutes. Now, doing time in Wabash Valley Corrections Centre, Brown maintains that he murdered no less than 13 other women. (American)

Cindy WOCKNER & Madonna KING

One-way Ticket: The Untold Story of the Bali 9

302pp Tp 29.95

On 17 April 2005, nine young Australians were arrested in Bali on charges of trafficking heroin. Four of the group - Renae Lawrence, Martin Stephens, Scott Rush and Michael Czugaj - were caught with the drugs taped to their bodies. Two others, Andrew Chan and Myuran Sukumaran, were alleged to be the ringleaders of the operation. And a final three - Si Yi Chen, Tan Duc Thanh Nguyen and Matthew Norman - were also scooped up as the final element in the Bali 9, as the group came to be known. With the cooperation of several family members of the Bali 9, the authors explore the histories of these eight men and one woman who have so unwittingly come into the public eye, to try to discover why these young people would take such a perilous risk. They also look at the controversial role of the Australian Federal Police in the fate of the Bali 9, and they are present at the trials and sentencing. (Australian)
