The Amber Room



In 1941, German troops invaded the Soviet Union, looting everything in their wake and seizing the Amber Room. When the Allies began the bombing of Germany in August 1944, the Room was hidden and despite the best efforts of treasure hunters and art collectors from around the world, it has never been seen again. Now, two powerful men have set their best operatives loose in pursuit, and the hunt has begun once more. (American)

There are no red herrings in this narrative as the crime is played out on the page, but it is the mental processes behind the murderer's sinister act that are the real pieces of this puzzle. * Confessions of a Deathmaiden 408pp Pb 15.95

As a death maiden, Frances' mission is to help people pass into the next reality, just as a baby is ushered into the world by a midwife. But at the hospital, Tomas dies under mysterious circumstances and before time. Now, with an intricately carved piece of Mayan Jade that belonged to Tomas in hand, Frances travels to Mexico to find the truth behind her young charge's untimely death. (Mexican-American)

★ Fallen Idols 500pp Pb 17.95 First stumbled upon by a worker searching for rubber trees, the ancient Mayan site of La Chimenea had immediately become a hotbed of great historical and political interest. Nobody was more excited about leading the dig than Walt and Jocelyn Gaines. Three months later, they were attacked. When the smoke cleared, one person lay dead: Jocelyn. Revelation by revelation, this is an expertly nuanced saga of a family that will have you questioning everything you thought you knew about the people you trust. (American)
