

Fox's third novel following Malicious Intent and Without Consent (both Pb \$19.95) does not feature Dr Anya

Crichton, the main character in the first two books, but instead features Detective Sergeant Kate Farrar, whom we last met in **Malicious Intent**. Kate has returned to work after her ordeal and some much-needed leave, and has a new partner, Detective Constable Oliver Parke. The novel starts with the discovery of a dead woman in a burnt-out house, who turns out to be an unknown mother. Given the author's interest in forensic medicine, you will get to learn a lot about the effects of fire on the human body and a number of other forensic facts too! Kate and Oliver are then moved on to another seemingly political case of a missing daughter. How these separate cases come together forms the plot behind this excellent new novel.

I have to admit to being a fan and I especially found **Skin and Bone** (276pp Tp \$32.95) hard to put down. The characters of Kate and Oliver and their problems kept me interested to the very last page. The setting is Sydney and Fox demonstrates a good knowledge of the city and the seamier side of things, along with some interesting sidelights into human behaviour, both good and bad.

If you enjoy crime novels with a solid forensic and police procedural background, then I highly recommend this latest novel.
