

416pp Tp \$32.99 Bosch #14. Harry Bosch is assigned to a homicide call in South LA that takes him to Fortune Liquors, where the Chinese owner has been shot to death behind the counter in a robbery. Joined by

members of the department's Asian Crime Unit, Bosch relentlessly investigates the killing and soon identifies a suspect, a Los Angeles member of a Hong Kong triad. But before Harry can close in, he gets the word that his young daughter Maddie, who lives in Hong Kong with her mother, is missing. Could her disappearance and the case be connected? Daniel SMITH The Sherlock Holmes Companion An Elementary Guide 224pp Hb \$39.95


This gathers together an astounding range of Holmesian information! Included are synopses of the four novels and 56 stories; profiles of beloved characters such as Mrs Hudson (the great detective's long-suffering landlady) and Lestrade (the perennially baffled Scotland Yard detective); essays discussing themes such as Holmes' attitude towards women and his use of contemporary forensic science; and, highlights of the various renditions of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's stories on screen, including interviews with actors who have played the roles of Holmes and Watson. Artwork includes the classic work of Sidney Paget, stills from film and TV adaptations, cover artwork for various editions published over the years

and contemporary photographs of the settings of various stories. (American) Due Nov

Australia and Sherlock Holmes 208pp Hb \$79.95

This title captures the distinctive Sherlockian voice from 'Down Under', providing context for, and an introduction to, Sherlock Holmes in Australia. It gathers materials written from 1959 to 2007, mostly from *News from the Diggings* and *The Passengers' Log*. These incisively-written scholarly essays include two pieces about the larger-than-life Richard Hughes, an Australian journalist who made one of the scoops of the (last) century by obtaining the first interview with the Cambridge spies, Burgess and Maclean. (Hughes was a real-life inspiration for novelists John le Carré and lan Fleming). Popular culture is well-represented by a piece covering Sherlock Holmes film concepts that were never filmed, and accompanied by delightful, apocryphal movie posters. Well-reasoned papers link both Watson's




childhood and the speckled band snake to Australia, and a fine essay addresses "The Gloria Scott," plus much more attesting to the continuing popularity of the great detective around the globe, particularly in Australia. (Australian)


True Blue
